Throughout the administration of CFMC's countywide survey and outreach initiative, residents reported specific concerns and opportunities related to youth.

In response, a second survey was developed to collect input directly from Morgan County's young adults.

CFMC engaged students at six local high schools. A total of 709 students completed the survey over three weeks.


Survey findings will be invaluable in helping to shape CFMC's work with youth and education throughout the county.






AGE GENDER










WHAT TYPE OF POST-GRADUATION ASSISTANCE DO YOU NEED MOST?







EXTRACURRICULAR PARTICIPATION BY CATEGORY



Support Students from Low-Income Households

The majority of students prioritized financial assistance for students from low-income families, and would fund:

- Free school lunches and improved access to food for lowincome households
- School books, materials, and extracurricular activities
- Transportation to and from school/activities/work, especially during the winter
- Basic needs such as shoes, clothes, haircuts
- Scholarship programs to make continuing education a realistic goal, and driver's education possible
- Mobile hotspots to check out so all students can access internet at home

Develop Recreational and Safe Spaces for Youth

While hometowns vary in regards to recreational facilities, there is countywide consensus that there aren't enough locations for safe, healthy, and inexpensive recreation. Suggested upgrades include:

- Build youth centers / clubhouses where kids can gather and just hang out, work on homework
- Improve recreation centers to make them more teenfriendly, not just for little kids
- Build/revitalize basketball courts, skate parks, pool, YMCA-type gym
- Mall, movie theater, bowling, roller rink, arcade

Student Insight

Students would like to be involved in the design and management of youth centers, and suggest that they are located near school to avoid transportation issues.

Offer Innovative/Alternative Courses and Schedules

In addition to highlighting a countywide demand for more coursework related to trades and life skills, students would like to see courses offering:

Life Skills	Finances, professional development, leadership, household management
Business Skills	Opportunities to develop/practice innovative, entrepreneurial thinking
Foreign Languages	Via online learning if no teachers are available
Alternative Academics	Options for students who struggle in the current system
Non-College Readiness	To prepare students for trades, business, etc. and validate their career goals
Arts	Fine arts, performing arts, careers in the arts

Upgrade School Facilities/Amenities

Students shared some frustrations about their school facilities, and would like to spend money on:

- Bathrooms fixing sinks, toilets, doors, tiles
- More drinking fountains
- Better health clinics
- Upgraded sports equipment and facilities
- More windows in classrooms
- iPads and better computers
- Healthier lunches fresh produce, plant-based options

Teen-Run Safe Space

A few students suggested the creation of a teen-run safe space, offering peer counseling and a place for students to share their approaches to dealing with trouble at home, anxiety about the future, addiction, and peer pressure, etc.

Take Time to Listen	Youth pastors, grandparents, friends, teachers, coaches
